# **Our Mission Statement**

We create a daytime sanctuary and multi-resource center for homeless and at-risk individuals with core values of healing, spirituality, recovery, peer empowerment, dignity, nonviolence, advocacy, voice, sustainability and mutual transformation. This sanctuary is a place to be, belong, and become within a transformational solidarity community—interfaith, nonpartisan, intercultural, and noncanonical—a racially and economically diverse family of hope. We seek to strengthen Milwaukee's overwhelmed safety net.

# To Be, Belong, and Become

In the heart of Milwaukee's most impoverished neighborhood, set in the 53206 zip code, our dedicated staff and volunteers work to fulfill our mission by creating a community; connecting guests to community resources; providing food security; and meeting essential needs. MBHS delivers a unique, nationally-recognized model, with those we serve taking leadership roles and engaging in decision making. We function as a community in which persons who are homeless or at risk of homelessness work side-by-side with other volunteers from diverse backgrounds, serving in solidarity as equals.

# We are 53206

The MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary serves those in need in Milwaukee. Because out Sanctuary building is located in the 53206 zip code, the majority of our guests live in the immediate neighborhood.

53206 is the poorest zip code in Wisconsin and one of the poorest in the country.

Milwaukee mayor Cavalier Johnson, a long-time resident of 53206, notes that it is plagued by "Substandard housing, familial violence, qun violence, food scarcity, eviction, theft and threat of death."

- Hunger, homelessness, and housing insecurity have risen significantly since the onset of Covid in Milwaukee.
   53206 is a "food desert" without a single dedicated grocery store.
- 82% of residents live below the threshold for food assistance programs. More than two-thirds of the children in 53206 live in poverty.
- A third of Milwaukee's 2,940 vacant lots are located in 53206.
- Nearly 95 percent of its residents are black. No other ZIP code has a greater percentage of African Americans.
- Residents received the lowest rating for health outcomes, based on access to quality healthcare; health behaviors; physical environment; poverty and education.
- More that 5,600 housing code violations were filed in 2021.
   Evictions are the highest in the state.
